What they witnessed was shocking—an entire generation of children lost to neglect, exploitation, and ignorance. Moved by what they saw, they offered these children care, compassion, and humanity. As a result, these children were reborn, finding a new path in life.

From this experience, "Mercy Home" was born.

"Achievements of "Mercy Home

:In Childcare

Monitoring 200 at-risk children through protection-programs, and providing healthcare, educational, and .livelihood support

Opening the "Mercy Home," a fully equipped house-with furniture, toys, and activities for children in need, .providing support for two years

-Fulfilling the wishes of over 50 children.

-Reintegrating 50 school dropouts into classrooms and referring 20 children to a literacy center.

In Combating Drug Addiction:

-Sponsoring the treatment of approximately 20 drug addicts, with case management for 100 young drug addicts.

-Organizing various sports and recreational activities for over 50 young individuals struggling with drug addiction.

In Livelihood and Development Assistance:

-Providing job opportunities for several needy families.

-Empowerment training for over 50 women.

-Providing food and financial assistance to over 100 families for a sustained period.

-Distributing 3,000 Iftar meals during Ramadan annually.

In Educational, Psychological, and Health Support:

-Providing psychosocial support for over 50 men.

-Opening an academic support center for the children of Mar Elias Camp in Beirut.

-Providing assistance with medical examinations, radiology, and medications for numerous families and their children, along with healthcare support for over 30 children.

The association also launched the "Educational Project for Literacy" in Sudan, with providing 750 food parcels to Sudanese Families.

A Touch of Mercy

- A 32-year-old man, married with a daughter, worked in the radiology department of a private hospital. He developed a neck disc due to wearing a heavy radiation vest, leading to his addiction to painkillers, job loss, and subsequent divorce. After spending some time homeless, he sought help from Mercy Home and was referred to a rehabilitation center for addiction treatment.

He successfully completed his treatment, secured a new job, and reunited with his wife and daughter, **thus restoring his family and financial .stability**

- A child witnessed a horrifying moment when his father hanged himself right before his eyes. This deep trauma significantly affected his behavior, making him violent towards his mother and siblings, and leading him to drop out of school. Feeling lost and overwhelmed, he began blaming his mother for what had happened and was forced to take on the burden of working to pay off his father's debts, all while being constantly pursued by creditors.

Mercy Home intervened, providing him with intensive psychological and social support. With the help of the organization, the child was able to overcome his trauma, and feelings of sadness and blame, and regain his confidence in life. The association also guided him back into education. Today, he has become a nurse, supporting his family, and stands as a symbol of
